

Comprehensive Orientation Travel Planner - Freshman Orientation Program - June and July 2008

Welcome to UNI! Orientation provides you and your family an excellent opportunity to learn more about UNI. The information below will assist you in making plans to attend orientation. We look forward to meeting you!

Check-in Time and Location

Rider Hall (building #46 on campus map)
8:00-10:00 a.m.

Note: Check-in normally takes only a few minutes. However, between 9-10 a.m., check-in may take longer. Be sure to allow plenty of time to arrive, unload, and check-in before the opening session.

Orientation Participation Fees

Fees are collected when you check in. Participation fees are required for both student and parent program participants. Cash or check are accepted.

Option 1 - Complete Program - \$35

Includes overnight accommodations, lunch and dinner on day one, continental breakfast on day two; refreshment breaks, use of the Wellness Recreation Center and on-campus parking.

Option 2 - Meals Only (No Overnight) - \$25

Includes lunch and dinner on day one, continental breakfast on day two, refreshment breaks; use of the Wellness Recreation Center and on-campus parking.

Option 3 - Basic Program (includes lunch) - \$15

Includes lunch on day one, continental breakfast on day 2, refreshment breaks; use of the Wellness Recreation Center and on-campus parking.

Parking

Available in the lots just east of Rider and Shull Halls. Take 27th street east off Hudson Road. 27th Street will curve around to the south, and the lots will be to the west. Please do not park in other campus lots.

- ☛ small fan (Rider Hall is not air conditioned)

- ☛ cash or check to pay for orientation

Housing in Rider Hall

Linens, towels, pillows are provided for those staying overnight. Students are housed with another new student. Parents and family members will be housed in single rooms.
