



Application Process



1. **Application** - Complete the attached application for admission, answering all sections completely.
You may also apply electronically by visiting our website at www.uni.edu/intladm
 2. **Application Fee** - Send a bank draft or money order in the amount of \$50 (undergraduate) or \$70 (graduate) made payable to the University of Northern Iowa. Credit card payment can be made for electronic applications.
 3. **Educational Transcripts** - All official school transcripts, bearing the seal and signature of a school registrar, should be mailed directly from the institution to UNI.
 - Academic/School Records must show years of attendance, courses, grades, month and year of graduation and degree/ diploma awarded.
 - All transcripts in a language other than English must be accompanied by an English translation.
 - Students applying for masters or doctoral programs must submit transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended.
 - Transfer credit can be awarded only on the basis of course descriptions (syllabi) in English.
 4. **English Proficiency** - All applicants who are not native speakers of English must submit proof of English proficiency.

Undergraduate students must submit one of the following:

 - TOEFL – (paper-based) 550/ (internet-based) 79
 - IELTS – 6.0
 - SAT – 460 (critical reading)
 - Other alternatives to the TOEFL for undergraduate students can be found at www.uni.edu/intladm/alttoefl.shtml

Graduate students must submit one of the following:

 - TOEFL – (paper-based) 550/ (internet-based) 79
 - IELTS – 6.5
 - Some academic departments require higher scores.

Conditional admission may be considered for students who are academically qualified but do not meet the English proficiency requirement. Students will be required to complete an English placement test upon arrival. Results will determine need for full-, part-time or no intensive English courses.

 5. **Other Tests** - Graduate students are sometimes required to submit other test scores and reference letters. Refer to the chart on page 9 for additional information.
 6. **Financial Support Form** - Complete the Financial Statement and Certification Form and send with supporting documents. If you are dependent on a graduate assistantship, **you must still submit this form and circle #4.**
 7. **International Student Advisor Report** - Students transferring directly from a U.S. institution to UNI must also submit this form. This one-page form will be sent to students who identify themselves in this category, or can be downloaded at www.uni.edu/intladm/studentadvisor.pdf
