Why should I get a minor?

Most majors only require around 40-60 credits. When added together with 45 credits in the Liberal Arts Core you have 85-105 credits. In order to graduate you will need at least 120 credits. Also, a minor can help show employers that you have specific knowledge in a content area that they may be interested in.
