Accomplishments of the Fall 2006 Semester

Professional Development

- Had two guest speakers plus one field trip to Des Moines to meet with various nonprofit sector leaders
- Maintained and increased partnerships with five nonprofit organizations
- Decreased internship partnership with national nonprofit organization from four to three (will be likely be exceeded at end of academic year)
- Increased from ten to fourteen Advisory Board members
- Increase participants to the American Humanics Management Institute from twelve to twenty-one

Resource Development

- Increased total sponsorship giving from \$3665.00 to \$9200.00
- Increased corporate giving from \$845.00 to \$1275.00
- Increased student giving to \$270.00
- Increased alumni giving from \$175.00 to \$380.00
- Decreased UNI giving from \$4420.00 to \$3450.00
- Increased funds to support interns to \$4000.00
- Increased funds from events from to \$2383.00

Membership

- Increased individual meeting attendance from twenty-two to forty
- Increased national certification from ten to fourteen
- Increased non-LYHS participating students from six to ten
- Increased average meeting from seventeen to twenty-two
- Increased recruitment events from one to three
- Upgraded the website
- Upgraded promotional materials

Community Service

- Implement Volunteer Fair in collaboration with the Volunteer Center of Cedar Valley that drew 400 students
- Increase the number of hours students give to American Humanics projects to 588
- Increase the number of hours individual students work/volunteer with nonprofit organizations to 1042
