**Assistant Professor of Communication Sciences and Disorders**

**Specialization:** Preparation for teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in speech-language pathology. All areas of specialization will be considered. Applicants with expertise in augmentative communication or pediatric neuromotor speech and swallowing disorders are preferred.

**Required Qualifications:** Ph.D., speech-language pathology or related discipline; ABD with expected graduation date of December 2008 will be considered. Eligibility for CCC-SLP and Iowa License in speech-language pathology also required.

**Responsibilities:** Teaching undergraduate professional courses and graduate courses in communicative disorders. Clinical teaching and research activity is required.

**Department:** The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders has nine (9) full-time doctoral level faculty and staff members and several part-time clinical instructors. The Department has approximately 130 undergraduate declared majors and 49 graduate students in speech-language pathology. The Department houses the Sertoma Research Laboratory, has faculty who have held leadership positions at a national level, provides support for faculty and students travel/research, and has active NSSLHA and international study abroad groups.
