**Conceal and carry on college campuses:  
Would college students attending class with loaded guns deter another massacre?**

Virginia Tech University. University of Shepherdstown. Arizona Nursing College. University of Iowa. These are but four examples of many where angry college students shot and killed students, faculty, and staff on campus. The gun issue itself is politically divisive, if not explosive. However, in April 2009, Missouri and Texas House of Representative members voted to lift bans of conceal and carry on public colleges and universities with the eventual aim of allowing students to bring firearms to their classes. **Invisible Children: The Formation of Community**

On June 22nd and 23rd, the biggest lobby day in American history was history in the making, with the hope of leading to long overdue peace and safety for the children caught in the crossfire of Joseph Kony's war in Uganda. For two days this past summer, concerned citizens (and some high-profile cheerleaders) from every corner of the country descended upon D.C. with one message: the time for peace is now, and this is how it ends. The program included lobbying trainings, VIP speakers, a kick-off rally and culminated in an unprecedented outpouring of activism on Capitol Hill, with hundreds of meetings taking place between Members of Congress and their constituents. This past school year, students from UNI, with the leadership of Alex Welsh, began *Invisible Children, The Rescue* organization at UNI. Alex, along with several other students, participated in a Rescue and will discuss how through activism, a community formed. The session will begin with viewing the documentary and follow with discussion.
