

How To Do Research in Ancient History

To develop a research bibliography for a project in ancient history, classical civilization, or archaeology, you can use resources like JSTOR or Google Scholar, but the most comprehensive resource is the annual French bibliographic publication *L'Année Philologique*. The Rod Library has a subscription to the on-line *L'Année Philologique*, which you can access in the following manner:

- Go to the UNI Home Page.
- Click on Rod Library.
- Under Journals and Magazine Articles, click on Databases A-Z.
- Scroll down the alphabetical list to *Annee Philologique* and click on it.
- In the Search field, to do a keyword search for a subject or topic, click on Full Text. Then type in the subject or keyword for which you want references. Try a variety of subjects/keywords related to your topic. To search for a modern author's published work, click on Modern Authors and type in the author's name. For works on an ancient writer, click on Ancient Authors and Texts and type in the author's name or the name of the text. Make sure you choose a sort preference. "Sort by date (newest first)" typically is preferable.
- *L'Annee* will give you ONLY the authors and titles of works, not the full texts themselves, like JSTOR sometimes will. You must then go to the Interlibrary Loan desk and order copies of those books or journal articles which are not in the Rod Library's collection.
- To see a synopsis of the book or article, click on an entry's title. Synopses are written either in English, French, or German. The language in which the synopsis is written does NOT reflect the language in which the article or book is written. That will be indicated by the language of its title.

L'Annee journal article entries usually abbreviate the journals' titles. The journal abbreviation will be hyperlinked in red. Place your cursor on the hyperlink and the full journal title will appear in a small text box. Otherwise, you can consult the abbreviations list at the front of the print volumes of *L'Annee* in the Library, go to the abbreviations list at the front of the Oxford Classical Dictionary 3rd edition (in the Reference Section of the Library).

Print volumes of *L'Annee* from 1994 through 2002 are in the Rod Library Reference Section, catalog number Z 7016 .A56.
