Dining Services

The Rialto Dining Center will be open Monday breakfast through Friday lunch beginning on June 1 and ending July 31. Serving times for meals will be posted in the hall. Room Furnishings

Each room included single lofted beds, chest of drawers, desks, chairs and window blinds. Residents provide their own linens, pillow, towels, blanket, telephone (local phone service is provided) and other personal accessories. A study lamp is recommended. Refrigerators less than 4.5 cubic feet are permitted, along with microwave, TV, radio, stereo, hair dryer, popcorn popper, coffee pot and other small UL-approved appliances.
