 - Remember that whether you like it or not, you have a small role as an ambassador from your country to the local community. Keep this in mind as you live and study here.
 - The UNI Public Safety Office often has bicycles that they

can loan to you while you study here. You only need to maintain the bike, repair it as needed, and return it when you leave UNI! Visit them in the Towers Center for assistance.

- Women and men serve as police officers, firefighters, and other authorities here in the U.S. Both genders have equal authority and must be treated with equal respect.

Cold Weather Tips

Keep the gas tank in your car close to full to prevent condensation or ice from developing in the tank.

Check the antifreeze level in the radiator of your car. Don't put plain water in the radiator!

Dry skin can be an annoying problem. While hot showers and baths may warm you up, they dry out your skin, so only use cool to warm water. Also, all lotions are not the same and you might need a lotion that heals dry skin, so read the label.

"Wind Chill" is what it feels like outside by combining the air temperature and the wind speed.

Ross' Reminders, Continued...

- Accepting bribes is NOT a part of U.S. law enforcement culture. Don't try to slip an officer a \$20 bill along with your driver's license if you are stopped for speeding. You'll get into even bigger trouble!
- The legal age to consume alcoholic beverages is 21 years or older. Drink responsibly, and never drive a car after drinking.
- Both UNI and Cedar Falls police officers are here to serve the public. You should always feel comfortable to approach an officer and ask questions or ask for help. (Unless you are stopped in your car for a violation. In that case, stay put and let the officer come to your window!)
- If you feel that you have been the victim of discrimination, harassment, or some other inappropriate behavior, you should tell the Dean of Students' office. They can help! Visit them in the Department of Residence office within the Redeker Center or call 3-2332.
