TEACHERS' GUIDE INTRODUCTION SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF IOWA (1870-1940)

The purpose of the *Explorations in Iowa History Project* is to provide supplementary primary source materials for teachers of Iowa history. This teachers' guide, *Social and Economic Development of Iowa (1870-1940)* targets the upper elementary and middle school levels. These project materials focus on the social and economic conditions which emerged as Iowa left the pioneer period and entered the twentieth century.

This guide is divided into three independent units:

Unit 1:The Rise of Technology (1870 - 1896) Unit II: The Golden Age (1897 - 1918) Unit III: The Depression (1919 - 1940)

Primary Source Material

The source materials supporting each unit vary greatly in their content and format. Ranging from narrative memoirs to advertising pamphlets, the materials not only allow students to experience the historian's methods but also provide firsthand insights into the lives of Iowans of the past. In most cases, the source materials have been reproduced in their original form unless otherwise identified. Errors of spelling, punctuation and usage have for the most part not been edited. *The Iowa Housewife, The Iowa Farmstead* and *The Iowa Agriculturalist* are facsimiles of period publication and contain authentic source materials but were never published in the form found within this project.
