

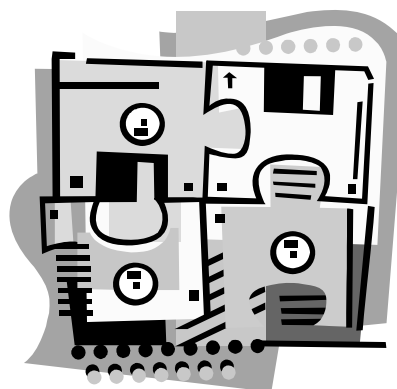

ITS-Educational Technology

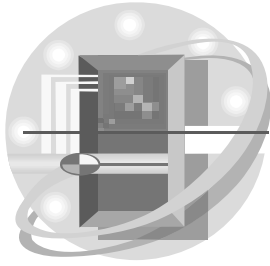
