I. Call to Order - President Randy Hayes called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

II. Approval of Minutes of Meeting #301 – Vicki moved to approve the minutes, seconded by Doug Case. Motion approved.

Presidents Prerogative – Reported that he believes that the University’s press release concerning salary increase delays was very helpful and timely.

III. Presentations and Reports

A. Maucker Union Construction Update – Jan Hanish

Jan reported that the \$13 million renovation project began in May of this year. There will be a total of approximately 60,000 square feet of combined construction/renovation of Maucker Union, which is a thirty-year-old building. Student fees are funding the construction and renovation.

There are four major components to this construction/renovation project. The first is a complete renovation of the food service area. The second component is new office space for International Services, Student Activities, Student Organizations and Student Government, as well as space for the Center for Multicultural Education. The third area is the renovation of meeting rooms and upgrading of furnishings. The fourth component is expanded retail space. A hallway will directly link Lang Hall to the Union.

Jan displayed architectural drawings of the exterior and entrances to the building. The east side renovation is presently being worked on and is scheduled for completion by mid-Fall of 2003. The northwest entrance by Union Station will be reconfigured to an on-grade level. The new food court will be well done and its eclectic design will appeal to students.

Plans are for the Union to be open during the renovation except for the summer of 2003 when it will be closed for a few months. Total renovation of the Union is scheduled to be complete by Fall 2004. The relocation of student organizations and activities adjacent to International Services and the Center for Multicultural Education will allow for greater interaction and communication to better meet the needs of all students.
